

# Converting a Pashmina Shawl to a Shrug

*This technique was demonstrated on Martha's Sewing Room, Show #2806.*

## Supplies

- Pashmina shawl (approximate size 29 x 70 inches)
- Embroidery thread to coordinate with shawl
- 1-3/4 yds of 1/4" fusible Steam A Sewm II Lite
- Size 70 sharp machine needle
- Chalk marker
- Glass head pins
- Basic sewing supplies

## Directions

1. Fold and mark the vertical center of the Pashmina by pressing a crease or marking with a chalk marker. Mark the top long edge 4" on each side of the center (Mark A). Figure 1
2. Fold the lower right hand corner up to meet Mark A on your right. Mark 8" from the far right point (Mark B). This area will be the "armhole." Do not sew the armhole closed. Baste the edges together between the Marks A and B. Repeat for the opposite side. Figure 2
3. Fuse the Steam A Seam to the back side of the seam between the two B marks. Press the fused seam to the shrug back. Sew a decorative stitch over the seam or fuse ribbon over the seam and sew a decorative stitch over the ribbon through all layers. Figure 3

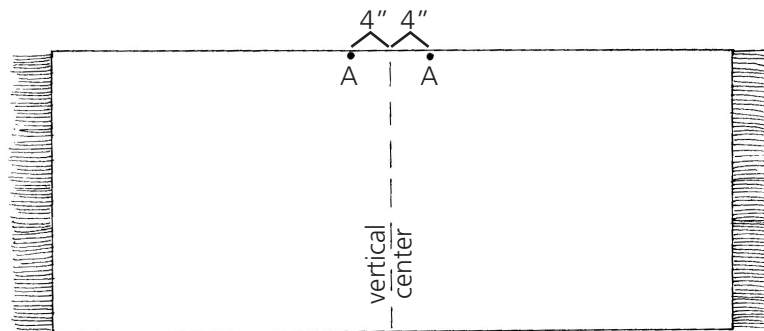

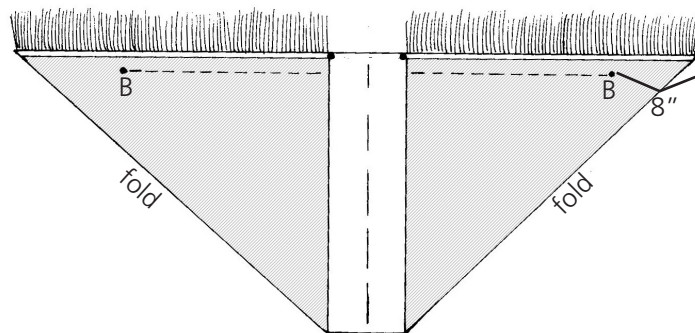

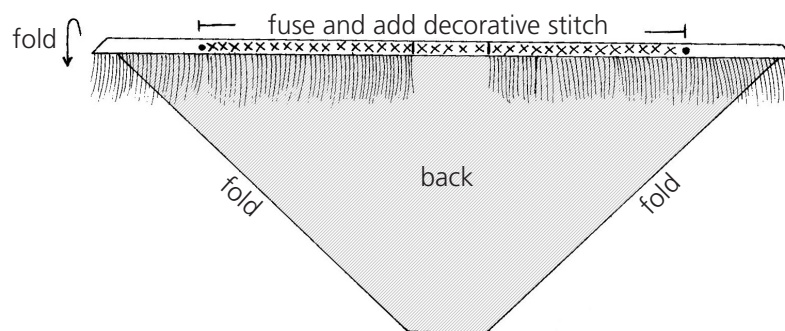
